Estrada grew up between Los Angeles, and El Paso, Texas. He thought a lot about what growing up in two cities felt like, and how that experience defined him.


WHAT YOU WILL NEED



For this project, you'll simply need a piece of paper, and any drawing utensils of your choice.


Feel free to use a pen, pencil, colored pencils, crayons, whatever you have handy!




In this activity, you will design a fantastic creature made out of three unique segments, each part showing a different part of their identity.






Create three sections by folding two times your paper

WHAT IS IMPORTANT IS HAVING 3 SECTIONS!







The reason we folded the sheet into three sections is so that your figure can be divided into:

- the head and neck (the top)
- the torso and arms (middle)
- then the legs and feet (bottom)
